

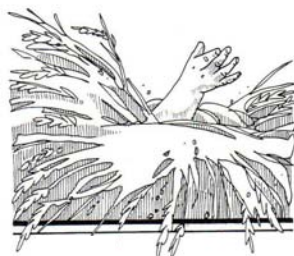

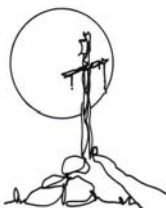

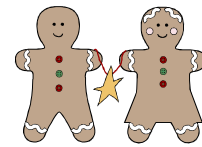

Florida Baptist Children's Home Gingerbread Tree Project

The Gingerbread Tree is the Children's Home's annual project which provides Christmas gifts for each child in their care. It's a special way for individuals or groups to give to and help care for the residents.

There are approximately 100 children to provide Christmas gifts for including campus residents and foster children. Each child selects gifts that he or she would like to receive, one in the small (\$10-\$20) category, and 2 each in the medium (\$20-\$45) category. Some of the gingerbreads will also provide gift cards for the foster/house parents caring for the children.

These gift requests are on a tree in the Children's Home's office. If preferred, a gift card can be purchased to be used towards a gift, or they will happily apply financial donations to Christmas for the children if that is your wish.

Those who would like to participate may stop by their office to select a gingerbread boy or girl or call Shannon Vaughan or Christal Kellogg at 878-1458. The gifts are due to their office no later than Wednesday, December 14.

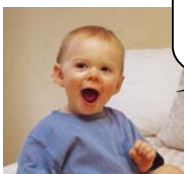

News for You!

April Livingston is stepping up as the new co-coordinator of Extended Session with Nevada Martinez. April is already a volunteer with Extended Session and JAM. Please take a moment next time you see her to let her know you appreciate her efforts with these children's ministries.

We continue to have open volunteer spots for Extended Session. Please consider spending one hour one Sunday every two months with the children in Extended Session. We can place you with your preferred age group. You will also have back up, plenty of toys, and snacks to help you with the children.

We continue to improve our security measures with Extended Session. Parents may have noticed that we are now using a bracelet system to match children with their parents. Each parent will receive one bracelet per child that has a number written on it that matches the number written on the child's bracelet when they drop their child off. We are requiring that you have this bracelet to pick up your child, or we will have to verify this in some other more time-consuming method. The cooperation of each parent in helping us to ensure their child's safety is much appreciated. Thank you.

Children's Ministry has two goals: 1) that all parents feel assured of our dedication to their child's safety and happiness while they are in our care; 2) that we teach and demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ to each child we come in contact with. Please consider helping us, however you can, in this ministry.

The 2011 theme is "His heart, His hands, His voice – I am Southern Baptist missions." As followers of Jesus, we – the Church – are called to be the body of Christ. We are His heart, His hands and His voice in the midst of a world filled with unreached peoples. We are part of the task to fulfill the Great Commission. And although we Southern Baptists have been praying, giving and going for 160 years, the work is not finished.

One of the ways we can be Jesus' heart, hands, and voice is through prayer. In fact, prayer is first and foremost! Pray with God's heart for people groups who have never heard the Good News. (Would our church even consider adopting a people group to pray for?) Pray for our missionaries who are our voice in the darkness. Pray about giving as much as you can to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering to sustain those we've sent to be our hands touching a lost world.

Think your gift won't make a difference? Every penny given to the Lottie Moon Offering helps support Southern Baptist missionaries serving overseas. Last year, those missionaries reported 360,876 baptisms and 29,237 new churches! There is much work to be done. The task is doable, but it will take all of us – starting with our own church!

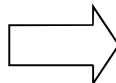

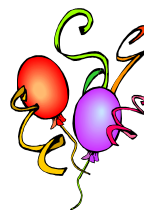
