As we move along into the year 2012, we want to remind ourselves of some things our Lord taught us about being His followers – His disciples. One of the most important is:



**“YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.” This is the great and foremost commandment. The second is like**

**it, ‘YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.’ “On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets.” — Jesus (Matthew 22:37-40)**

As I think about that passage, I remember well what the late Homer Lindsay Jr. taught the people of First Baptist Jacksonville, for many years; he told them that the greatest need of the church was not Sunday school attendance, nor tithing, nor worship attendance, nor... and he listed several things that, while being very important in our serving the Lord Jesus, pale in comparison to the one thing needed above all – LOVE GOD! I don't usually worry myself with a bunch of New Years resolutions, but this is one upon which we can all agree! Let's make it our hearts desire to follow the great commandment this year.

And there is another of our Lord's directives that we must not forget. It needs to be way up near the top of the list of our commitments. It should be right along with worship, tithing, caring, etc... What is it? It is evangelism.

We have had a lot of opportunities for evangelism training dur-

ing the years. We have people trained in Continuing Witness Training, FAITH Evangelism, The NET, and probably a few others. These have been used of God to bring people to faith in Jesus many times, but, just like many other programs, projects, and ministries in the church, they begin to slow and almost come to a halt.

We live in a different world than we did a few years ago. (Come on, preacher, ya think!) How would you like to know that someone will spend eternity in Heaven with Jesus (and with you) because you told them about Jesus? Don't answer that question...I know you would be blessed.

Look up! God is alive and well! Don't tell God how big your storms are (He already knows...). Tell your storms how big God is. Have a wonderful day!
